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WHAT IS THE **179D Deduction**?

The Energy Efficient Commercial Buildings Deduction, or 179D Deduction, rewards architects, engineers, and subcontractors for energyefficient projects on tax-exempt or some private sector properties.

Companies can receive up to \$1.88 per square foot for improvements that exceed current energy thresholds. Due to changes in the Inflation Reduction Act, the deduction's maximum reward has increased from \$1.88 per square foot to \$5.00 per square foot for qualifying projects from 2023 onwards.

ELIGIBLE IMPROVEMENTS

Architecture and engineering firms are typically responsible for designing and fitting a building's technical specifications.

Construction or improvements to building lights for energy efficiency
